### What is Collocation?

A collocation is a group of words that has an above average possibility of being found together.

The examiner will be judging you on this. For example, here is what the IELTS public band descriptors say for an IELTS band 7 for lexical resource:

"uses less common lexical items with some awareness of style and collocation"

So to achieve a band 7 in this criteria, not only do you need to be using some less common words, you also need to show to some extent that you know what other words these less common words are usually used with.

#### The risks agriculture faces in developing countries




## **Spaced Repetition**
